MONTESSORI & COVID-19

PLEASE REMIND YOUR CHILDREN ABOUT A FEW PROTOCOLS:

- Students must wear their face shields at all times on campus.
- Students must wait OUTSIDE the classroom until their temperature is measured and recorded and shoes disinfected. If your child arrives late, he or she must WAIT at the door until greeted.
- At dismissal, children are directed to stand in socially distanced lines as marked out near the roundabout. As dismissal times are staggered among Montessori and CIA students, we must be waiting in our designated line on time, and we appreciate your timely arrival in return.
- Please send ONLY snacks that can be eaten without lifting or removing the shield and drinks that can be consumed with a straw.
- If your child is ill, please feel free to allow him or her to rest at home as needed. It is NOT necessary to log in to class on those days; however, a student may work on weekly spelling, math or online exercises, if circumstances permit.

As we now are back in Room 203, all school materials – including pencil cases, textbooks, novels, workbooks and photocopies -- must be available in the classroom each day.


Typically, children will bring home only weekly spelling and assigned pages from their Spectrum math workbooks.

In addition to their Montessori Albanesi classwork, all UE students have weekly Spectrum Math, Spellwell/Spelling, No Red Ink and ReadWorks assignments due on Fridays.

As this work is reported on students' report cards, please ensure that your children are completing all assignments regularly.

As always, UE enjoys our daily read-aloud sessions. We opened the school year with Kwame Alexander's <u>The Undefeated</u>, a picture book celebrating the accomplishments of African-Americans, and Jason Reynolds's <u>Look Both Ways</u>, a novel that weaves together the stories of middle-schoolers who await a figurative bus falling from the sky.
